# Glimpses of God from Glenn...

Have you heard the story about a newly appointed young preacher? He was contacted to hold a graveside service. Being new to the area, the preacher started early to the cemetery, but soon lost his way. After making several wrong turns, he final arrived a half-hour late. The hearse was nowhere in sight, and the work-crew was relaxing under a nearby tree, eating their lunch. The pastor went to the open grave and found that the vault lid was already in place. Not to be deterred, he took out his book and read the service in its entirety. As he returned to his car, he overheard one of the work-crew say: "Maybe we'd better tell him that's the septic tank."

Well, sometimes stuff just happens! We think we know what it is that we are looking at motivation and effort are not understood or even appreciated. Sometimes just showing up is what matters. Even if we don't understand all of the reasons or have all the answers to the many "why-questions" of life, we keep showing up to do what God has

asked us to do. We use our Godgiven gifts and talents.

But what makes a person a person? Is there some magical formula that makes a person? The old nursery rhymes once taught us that 'little girls are made of sugar and spice, and everything nice.' While 'little boys are made of snips and snails and puppy-dogs' tails.' For the record, other versions of the rhyme include additional items that little boys are made of - 'Snaps, Frogs, Snakes, or Slugs'.

While you may not be made of sugar or snails, you are made of something. Consider - what makes you? Is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, or self-control to be found within you? What about the seven virtues? Does faith, hope, charity, fortitude, justice, prudence, or temperance have a place with you? What gives you strength when life is easy or when life is difficult?

Michael Jordan once said, "I've missed more than 9,000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. Twenty-six times I've been trusted to take the game winning shot and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. And that is why I succeed." Michael kept using his talents; he didn't let difficulty, trials, or failures stop him.

Remember the song, 'We fall down, but we get up"? We get up again and again because God works through all things. As Lent draws toward an end, we rise together with Christ - forgiven, loved, and provided with an example to follow - Jesus! May every day be a little Easter in your life -Celebrating the bad with the good - Celebrating Good Friday AND Easter Sunday, May God always be found in the midst of all life - the good and the bad to lead each of us toward the way of Christ!
